## DEFINITIONS

### **Disability Status:**

A person with a disability is a person who (1) has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; (2) has a record of such impairment; or (3) is regarded as having such impairment.

Disabled Veteran means:

- i. a veteran of the U.S. Military, ground, naval or air service who is entitled to compensation (or who but for the receipt of military retired pay would be entitled to compensation) under laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, or
- ii. a person who was discharged or released from active duty because of a service-connected disability.

# Military Status:

#### Armed Forces Service Medal Veteran:

A veteran who, while serving on active duty in the U.S. military, ground, naval or air service, participated in a United States military operation for which an Armed Forces Service Medal was awarded pursuant to Executive Order 12985 (61 Fed. Reg. 1209).

#### Other Protected Veteran:

A veteran who served on active duty in the U.S. military ground, naval, or air service during a war or in a campaign or expedition, for which a campaign badge has been authorized under the laws administered by the Department of Defense. (This category includes most Vietnam-era veterans.) The information required to make this determination is available on the Internet at <a href="http://www.opm.gov/staffingportal/vgmedal2.asp">http://www.opm.gov/staffingportal/vgmedal2.asp</a>. A copy of the list also may be obtained by calling (301) 306-6752 and requesting that a copy of the list be mailed to you.

#### Armed Forces Medal Veteran and Other Protected Veteran:

Veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. military ground, naval, or air service who meet the definition of both categories for *Armed Forces Service Medal Veteran* and *Other Protected Veteran* should select this category (see definitions of the two individual categories above).

Veteran of the U.S. Military Whose Service is Not Included in Any of the Categories Listed Above Veterans who served in the U.S. military ground, naval, or air service who do not meet the definitions of either Armed Forces Service Medal Veteran or Other Protected Veteran may select this category (see definitions of the two individual categories above).
